39		Tumwater Joint Plan with a 2-1 vote. The Olympia and Lacey joint plans will be brought
40		to the Planning Commission in 2022 for review.

It was also 4 mentioned by Commissioner Nelson with the Planning Commission vacancies, a quorum 5 only needs 4 members at this time. 6 7 It was also asked if the Planning Commissioners receive the applications to review before 8 the BoCC makes their decision to fill vacancies to which Ms. Chaput confirmed they do 9 not usually but she can ask. 10 **6.** 6:45 P.M. WORK SESSION: SHORELINE MASTER PROGRAM 11 12 (Staff: Andrew Deffobis) 13 14 Mr. Deffobis presented the draft of the Shoreline Master Program with the options to 15 choose from, informed by public comments received. For Chapter 19.500 and 19.600, the Planning Commission discussed which permits should be required depending on the 16 17 development desired. Also discussed was whether or not to add development standards for 18 floating mussel rafts and remove development standards for net pens from the aquaculture section. For most areas of the Aquaculture section it was suggested not to duplicate 19 20 regulations if State and Federal rules already apply. There were questions and comments 21 by the Planning Commission which Mr. Deffobis answered. 22 23 7. 7:00 P.M. PUBLIC HEARING: A-7 LOW IMPACT DEVELOPMENT 24 TARGETED IMPROVEMENTS 25 (Staff: Andrew Boughan & Maya Teeple) 26 27 Chair Simmons opened the public hearing and gave instructions to the public to 28 testify. 29 30 The following people provided oral testimony: 31 32 None 33 34 Chair Simmons closed the public hearing at 7:05 p.m. 35 36 Mr. Boughan gave a brief presentation with background on the amendment. To date, there has been no comments received. 37 38 39 There were questions and comments by the Planning Commission which Mr. Boughan and 40 Ms. Teeple answered. 41 42 MOTION: Commissioner Karman moved to recommend approval on Development Code Docket item A-7, Low Impact Development which amends the Thurston County 43 Code, Chapters 20.03, 20.07, 20.30, 20.30A and 23.04 related to low impact 44 development regulations. Commissioner Casino seconded. Motion Carried. 45

2	8.	7:10 P.M. WORK SESSION: SHORELINE MASTER PROGRAM (Continued)
3		(Staff: Andrew Deffobis)
4		
5		The Planning Commission continued to discuss the aquaculture section and Mr. Deffobis
6		noted the decisions made, including to strike net pen development standards and to refrain
7		from adding development standards for mussel rafts. These operations will be governed by
8		the general development standards that apply to all aquaculture operations. The Planning
9		Commission requested that industrial uses be prohibited in the Shoreline Residential
10		environment, and allowed in the Rural Conservancy environment consistent with
11		provisions in state law. Staff will bring back discussion on industrial uses in the Urban
12 13		Conservancy environment. The Planning Commission asked that docks be allowed in the
13		Natural environment designation of Puget Sound if other permitting agencies allow this.
14		The Planning Commission chose to strike requirements to demonstrate alternatives to
15		docks are not viable prior to permitting a new dock. The Planning Commission asked about
16		agriculture in the SMP and the definition of "fallow". Mr. Deffobis suggested this topic
17		be brought back at another meeting to discuss, and also asked if there were any other items
18		the Planning Commission would like to discuss before finishing their recommendation to
19		the BOCC.
