**#1 - Sign Up for an Upcoming Homeowner Septic System Self-Inspection Certification Class** 



Thurston County Environmental Health is now offering homeowner septic inspector certification workshops to anyone who qualifies. Upon completion of this workshop, you will know the basics of septic systems and how they operate; what to flush and not to flush down your toilet; how to prolong the life of your septic system; and how to inspect your septic system and submit the inspection report to the county.

#### **Certification Qualifications:**

- Have one of the following septic system types:
  - Conventional Gravity
  - Pressure Distribution
  - Mound
  - Glendon® Biofilter, and;
- Access to a computer to view videos and submit inspection report online.

When: The workshop is offered twice a month

**#2 - Reminder: Property Taxes are due April 30** 



This is a reminder the deadline for Thurston County residents to pay their 2023 first half property taxes is **April 30**, **2023**. Because the 30th falls on a Sunday this year, the law allows the payment to be made the next business day, which is Monday, May 1st without late fees being added.

Taxpayers have four options for paying their property taxes:

- Online: Pay online at <a href="www.thurstoncountywa.gov/treasurer">www.thurstoncountywa.gov/treasurer</a>. There is no additional charge for the electronic check payment option on-line, but there is a 2.35% transaction fee for a major credit card payment and a flat fee of \$3.95 for a VISA debit card payment.
- Mail: Mail check or money order payments to the Thurston County Treasurer, 3000
  Pacific Ave SE, Olympia, WA 98501. Payments made by mail must be postmarked
  by May 1, 2023.
- **Drop Off:** Payments can be dropped in the secure outside drop box located near the flag poles at our new office location of 3000 Pacific Ave SE, Olympia.
- In-Person: Payments can be made in person at the Treasurer's Office, 3000 Pacific Ave SE, Olympia, WA 98501. Office hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. If paying by credit card there is a 2.35% transaction fee and a flat fee of \$3.95 for a VISA debit card payment.

As required by Washington State law, late fees will be charged for those who do not make their tax payment on time.

You can also sign up for Paperless Property Tax Bills to receive future property tax bills electronically, saving paper and postage. For those who create an account, it comes with the option to schedule your tax payment in advance of the due date and email payment reminders will be sent ahead of the due date.
